PRESENTATION

Louisa Arts Center: Mr. Bollinger and Mr. Hoh

 Mr. Michael Bollinger, Executive Artistic Director for the Louisa Arts Center, stood and spoke at length in reference to the Arts Center. Mr. Bollinger gave a power point presentation wherein he spoke of the Center's success over the recent years. Mr. Bollinger spoke of the importance of a public/private relationship, and requested that the Louisa Town Council continue to their support of the Louisa Arts Center for years to come. A brief discussion/question and answer period followed between Mr. Bollinger and Council.

Mayor Nuckols then asked Stephanie Koren, Board Member for the Louisa Arts Center, to speak about community a collaboration between the town, the Arts Center, and the Historical Society. Mrs. Koren gave a lengthy presentation explaining how such a collaboration would be beneficial for both the town and county, but explained that this concept is still in the research phase, and that no funding is needed to discuss the idea, and that all decision making would be made jointly. Mrs. Koren stated that she would like to present the idea to the Cooke Foundation pending Council's approval.

Following a brief question and answer period, Council took the following action:

The second CD was cashed in and deposited to the General Fund to be used for the Columbarium Contract Deposit.

7) Discussion/Action: LCWA Board Position Recommendation

Mayor Nuckols reported that the LCWA approved Mr. Filer's position on the board.

8) Discussion/Action: Handicap Parking

Mayor Nuckols addressed an issue that was brought to his attention regarding the lack of handicap parking on Main Street in the downtown area.

Mr. Gore stated that he was able to quickly look at the matter, and that the town has the authority under state law to adopt an ordinance to provide for and enforce handicap/disabled parking, but did not find any state legal requirements, unless specifically speaking of access to town facilities. Mr. Gore stated that the roadway belongs to the State of Virginia, not the town, and suggested that VDOT may be able to give more guidance. Mr. Gore added that he would continue researching the matter.
