questioned if the change had taken place based on comments in the minutes, then stated that he would check in with the Mayor.

Council member Artz made the motion to approve the agenda as amended. Council member Purcell seconded the motion. The vote went as follows: 4-0 in favor.

OLD BUSINESS

1) Discussion/Action: USDA RD Grant Funding Sewer Upgrade

Mr. Filer referred to the memo on the sewer relining project in the Council packet then briefed Council on the breakdown of the grant funding (TOL Loan - \$267,000; USDA Grant - \$765,000; USDA Search Grant completed and town reimbursed - \$30,000 = Total \$1,062,000) before making the recommendation to approve the resolution and move forward.

Council member Dulaney questioned if the Water & Sewer Committee had met to discuss the sewer line issue/grant funding and questioned if aging/problematic water lines had been prioritized in relation to other water/sewer matters.

Vice-Mayor Lassiter replied that the committee was aware of the sewer problems, but had not met to discuss the grant funding for the sewer upgrade. Ms. Lassiter stated that the committee has met to discuss the aging water lines and are currently searching for available funding.

Council member Dulaney made the motion to approve the resolution to move forward with grant funding. Council member Artz seconded the motion. The vote went as follows: 4-0 for.

NEW BUSINESS

1) Discussion/Action: Halloween Permit

Mr. Filer reported that the Central Virginia Assembly of God has

applied for a permit to host their 9th annual "No Fright Night" at the Louisa Fireman's Fairgrounds on Wednesday, October 31, 2018 from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. Mr. Filer stated that all the required documentation has been provided.

Council member Dulaney made the motion to approve the permit for the Central Virginia Assembly of God. Council member Purcell seconded the motion. The vote went as follows: 4-0 in favor.

2) Discussion/Action: Christmas Parade Permit

Mr. Filer reported that the Louisa County Parks and Recreation would like to host their annual Fall Festival and Christmas Parade in the Courthouse Square on Saturday, December 1, 2018 from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. with the parade starting at 1 p.m. (running to 2 p.m.). Mr. Filer added: that LCPR has also applied for the VDOT permit; Court approval; and has agreed to coordinate the parade route and traffic issues with the Town of Louisa Police Department.

Council member Artz made the motion to approve the Louisa County Parks and Recreation permit. Council member Dulaney seconded the motion. The vote went as follows: 4-0 in favor.

3) Discussion/Action: Enhancing Social Media Presence

Council member Dulaney spoke in regards to enhancing the town's social media presence. Mr. Dulaney explained that he would like to expand the town's ability to reach out to the community to provide them with general information and messages, but also information that would be helpful in emergency situations. Vice-Mayor Lassiter and Council member Artz were supportive of the idea. Mr. Dulaney requested that Mr. Filer and staff meet to discuss ideas.

4) Discussion/Action: Federal Surplus Equipment Program

Mr. Filer provided helpful information in his memo to Council that was included in the packet for their review.

A lengthy discussion was held between Council and staff regarding the Federal Surplus Equipment Program. During the discussion, Council member Dulaney asked Chief Roberts to speak about the details of the program and how it would be beneficial not only to the police department but also the public works department. Chief Roberts noted that there is no cost to participate in the program.

No vote was taken, as it was deemed unnecessary, but Council authorized the Chief of Police and the Town Manager to participate/enter into agreement with the Federal Surplus Equipment Program.

5) Discussion/Action: Parking Enforcement

Council member Dulaney reported that E360 is currently reviewing and revising our town code and stated that our parking ordinance is an area in need of revisions. Mr. Dulaney noted that there had been several complaints in regards to parking, and the town Police Department is not able to enforce parking violations as the code currently reads. Mr. Dulaney then asked Chief Roberts to speak in more detail about the matter.

Chief Roberts reported that he, staff, the Police Committee, and legal Counsel have been working on an amended draft of the current ordinance to bring it up to date and in line with state and local laws. Due to the current code not addressing specific issues regarding signage and fees, officers are not able to issue violations and enforce parking regulations. The draft was included in the packet for Council's review and recommendations.

Council member Dulaney requested removing the term "handicapped" from the ordinance and replacing it with "persons with disabilities".

6) Discussion/Action: CD Maturity Reinvestment Hillcrest Fund

Council member Dulaney made the motion to reinvest the CD (\$147,419.23 Hillcrest Fund) with Essex bank for 19 months at

2.27%. Council member Artz seconded the motion. The vote went as follows: Artz, for; Dulaney, for; Purcell, for; Carter, abstain (3-0 in favor).

7) Discussion/Action: Internet Fiber

Mr. Filer referred to the email correspondence between the Mayor and Bob Hardy who is the Technology Director with the County of Louisa. He then went on to explain that the County of Louisa received a federal grant to run fiber through the county to all the schools as well as the county office building and stated that they are willing to run it to the town police department. Mr. Filer stated that if the county can obtain an easement from CSX to bore under the railroad tracks then they will run it to the town office building as well. Mr. Filer added that Daniel Beam, with Computer Cabling & Technology Service, has stated that while running the fiber through the town they will rent ground penetrating radar and GPS any utilities they locate; and provide a shape file to the town and the Water Authority. Mr. Filer stated that there is no action to take on this matter, that it is simply informative at this time.

Council member Dulaney requested that Mr. Filer research CCTS's insurance coverage and what the protocol would be if they would hit one of our lines while working in town.
